Maids of Honor

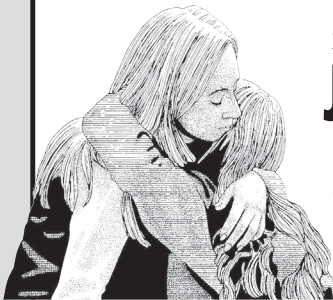

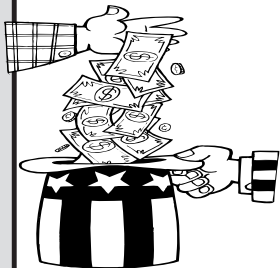
They're Playing Our Song
